VOTIVE MASS PROPERS


A Votive Mass is, in its origin, a Mass not celebrated as a part of the daily cycle of public masses and the corresponding Divine Offices following the cycle of the liturgical year. Rather, the Votive Mass is offered for a votum, a special intention, or out of devotion, ex voto, on behalf of the church, an individual member of the faithful or for a specific need that arises and requires a pastoral response. These Masses do not replace the normative Sunday and weekday liturgical life of a priest or of a parish. Rather, they augment it, adding to it an additional richness and a sensitive response to the pastoral needs of the faithful and the Church (for example, at a Synod or to celebrate the anniversary of ordination of a priest or the consecration of a bishop, or the anniversary of the dedication of a Church, the Dedication Festival, or a significant wedding anniversary, or an anniversary of the death of a loved one) as well as for grave needs of the world as a whole. These propers, readings, prayers and other liturgical texts are not those appointed for the liturgical day being celebrated, but are chosen with reference to the specific needs to be addressed. It is customary to omit the creed however the Gloria in Excelsis may be used on occasions of celebration. The liturgical colour is that which corresponds to the intention of the Mass and not that of the liturgical day in the yearly cycle. The choice of the Gradual, Tract and Eastertide Alleluia reflect the character of the Mass as well as a sensitivity to what is appropriate in certain seasons of the liturgical year.

Masses for various sacramental rites fall under this category as well – for example the Masses of Ordination, Matrimony, Ministry to the Sick and the Requiem Mass celebrated at a funeral or memorial service.

Tradition allows the celebration of Votive Masses in honour of the Holy Trinity, in order of give thanks to God, of the Holy Angels, of the holy Apostles Peter and Paul, of the Holy Spirit, of the most Holy Sacrament of the Eucharist, of the Holy Cross, of the Passion of our Lord Jesus Christ, of the Blessed Virgin Mary, for the Election of a new Patriarch, for the Ending of Schism, for Peace, in the Time of War, for Travellers, and for any Necessity.

Texts of the Psalms are drawn from the Septuagint translation and thus differ in places from the Hebrew based versions. Liturgical texts drawn from Missale Romanum Pius V, edition of Clement VIII, Urban VIII and Leo XIII 1906


The following Masses may be celebrated on weekdays for the devotion 51 of the priest when the Mass of the Sunday is not repeated. They are not to replace the proper Masses of feast days. In these, neither the Gloria in Excelsis nor the Credo are said, unless for public cause, in which case violet vestments are to be worn. Otherwise, the appropriate liturgical colour vestments are to be used. In Masses of the Blessed Virgin Mary celebrated on Saturday, and Masses of the Angels the Gloria in Excelsis is used. In Eastertide, two Alleluias are added at the to the conclusion of the Antiphon of the Introit if not printed in the text, and one Alleluia is added to the conclusion of the Offertory and Communion antiphons.

Then Jesus said unto them, Verily, verily, I say unto you, Except ye eat the flesh of the Son of man, and drink his blood, ye have no life in you. Whoso eateth my flesh, and drinketh my blood, hath eternal life; and I will raise him up at the last day. For my flesh is meat indeed, and my blood is drink indeed. He that eateth my flesh, and drinketh my blood, dwelleth in Me, and I in him. As the living Father hath sent Me, and I live by the Father : so he that eateth Me, even he shall live by Me. This is that bread which came down from heaven : not as your fathers did eat manna, and are dead : he that eateth of this bread shall live forever.



This I say therefore, and testify in the Lord, that ye henceforth walk not as other Gentiles walk, in the vanity of their mind. Having the understanding darkened, being alienated from the life of God through the ignorance of them, because of the blindness of their heart : Who being past feeling, have given themselves over unto lasciviousness,

to work all uncleanness with greediness.

But ye have not so learned Christ;

If so be that ye have heard Him, and have been taught by Him, as the truth is in Jesus.

The Holy GospelFeast of the Foundation of the Anglocatholic Church83

John 17 . 1, 11b - 21a

AT THAT TIME, Jesus, lifting up his eyes to heaven, said : Holy Father, keep through thine own Name those whom Thou hast given Me, that they may be *one*, as we are. While I was with them in the world, I kept them in thy Name : those that Thou gavest Me I have kept, and none of them is lost, but the son of perdition; that the scripture *might* be fulfilled. And now come I to Thee; and these things I speak in the world, that they might have my joy ful*filled* in themselves. I have given them thy word; and the world hath hated them. because they are not of the world, but that Thou shouldest keep *them* from evil. They are not of the world, even as I am *not* of the world. Sanctify them through thy truth : *thy* word is truth. And Thou hast sent Me into into the world, even so have I also sent them into the world. And for their sakes I sanctify myself, that they also might be sanctified *through* the truth.
